Thank you for requesting information on how to protect your home address in the Property Appraiser's records. Under Florida's broad public laws we must make public records, which include property ownership information available to the public. Florida Statutes provides a limited list (below) of property owners who may qualify to have their home addresses, phone numbers and in some cases additional data to be protected in our records. The categories listed below are abbreviated for space; for complete details of qualification, please refer to Section 119.071 Florida Statutes.

- A person who has been the victim of sexual battery, aggravated child abuse, aggravated stalking, harassment, aggravated battery, or domestic violence, with official verification that an applicable crime has occurred (5-year renewable exemption from date of request).

### Current and Former:

- All law enforcement personnel, including correctional and correctional probation officers.
- Personnel of the Department of Children and Families whose duties include the investigation of abuse, neglect, exploitation, fraud, theft, or other criminal activities.
- Personnel of the Department of Health whose duties are to support the investigation of child abuse or neglect.
- Personnel of the Department of Health whose duties relate to social security benefit determinations, investigations of complaints against or inspection of healthcare facilities\*.
- Personnel of the Department of Revenue or local governments whose responsibilities include revenue collection and enforcement or child support enforcement.
